## Good practice summary for harmful sexual behaviour in schools

## **Step 1 - Prevention**

Giving all learners the skills and knowledge to avoid harmful sexual behaviour.

Key learning - Relationships, Sexual Health & Parenthood Education to all learners at primary school on private body parts, touch, consent, healthy relationships, bullying, how babies are made, people who can help.

Key learning - Relationships, Sexual Health & Parenthood Education to all learners at secondary school on relationships, sex, abuse, online safety, the Law, people who can help.

## Step 2 - When harmful sexual behaviours occurs

All incidents recorded on SEEMIS, including low to high level incidents

Complete the Monitoring Form

Monitoring-Form.pdf (centralsexualhealth.org)

to include nature and context of behaviour, triggers/patterns, the voice of the child, the account of others, why the behaviour occurs, parent/carer responses, concerns and prior learning. This form links to the Traffic Light Tool and Hackett Continuum.

Develop a consistent Response to behaviour at home and school (e.g No, that's not okay).

Liaise with Child Protection Co-ordinator if appropriate. Risk assessment if required. Safety planning if required Resources for education settings | CSA Centre

## **Step 3 - Planning intervention**

Use the completed Monitoring Form from step 2 to identify what support the child/young person needs.

Additional paperwork- using the Good Lives Model and SHANARRI to take a holistic approach with a Young Person's Checklist <u>Checklist.pdf</u> (centralsexualhealth.org)

TAC meeting if required - allocate who does what (e.g. school teach RSHP, social work to support family, CAMHS assessment etc).
